HOW TO BUILD A SOWERS PLATFORM.

MATERIALS:

WALL

- 1 piece 1/2" plywood 4' x 8"
- 1 piece 1/2" plywood 5' x 8"
- 6 feet of 2" x 2"
- 12 feet of 2" x 2"
- 40 feet of 2" x 1"

SHIMS (with screws)

- 3 pieces 2" x 1"
- 3 pieces 1 1/2" x 1"
- 6 pieces 3" x 2"
- 6 pieces 4" x 1 1/2" strong hinges
- 2 sets 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" loose pin hinges (or smaller).

SCREENING:

- 4 pieces 3/16" screen bolts with wingnuts.
- 1 carriage bolt 2" x 1 1/2" and wingnuts.
- Screws: 1 1/2", 1" & 3/4"
- 2 pieces sliding latch
- 10" small wheel
- Wheeler's Paint? Glue.
