Enshrined in their constitution are these principles of faith that govern their conduct, which are:


- * Recognizing the supremacy of God

OAC Bahamas is led by Ted Thompson, the national director, and was founded by Keith Phillips and David Wilson. Ted and his wife, Cynthia, began this work in Nassau, the capital of New Providence, in 2008. The government granted registration on August 10, 2010, establishing this OAC branch with a

team of ten trustees and staff evangelists. OAC Bahamas exists as a ministry of evangelism committed to preaching the gospel to the unreached through open-air and other outreaches in partnership with the church, including training evangelists of all ages to use sketchboard messages. From time to time, other OAC staff travel to this country to assist with outreach.

In 2019, Hurricane Dorian hit us as a devastating Category 5 storm. After it was all over, many ministry opportunities opened up for our staff in this branch. Ted and Cynthia opened up their home in Nassau, which became a shelter and place of lodging. God has opened the door for OAC Bahamas to minister in conjunction with the Kiwanis Club in providing Christmas gifts to the children of inmates and youth. Ted was able to use his sketchboard during these times, and the Lord has blessed him.
